

and the Kilgore College Theatre Department. Many friendly ArtWalk visitors stopped by to learn more, including a few of Ms. Dalby's former students!





Co-directed by Meaghan and Matthew Simpson, this production features TSF favorites performing alongside Kilgore College theatre majors. Performances will take place **December 4–7** in the Van Cliburn Auditorium on the Kilgore College campus.
